The Scottish Central Authority is writing to provide an update on how service under the 1965 Hague Convention on the Service Abroad of Judicial and Extrajudicial Documents in Civil and Commercial Matters will be carried out in Scotland.

Service under the Hague Convention

The Scottish Government has considered the UK declarations made to the Hague Conference on Private International Law regarding Articles 10(b) and (c) of the Hague Service Convention. We can confirm that the Scottish Government's view is that the UK declarations do not prevent service being received, and carried out, by messengers-at-arms or sheriff officers in Scotland under either Article 10(b) or 10(c).

Article 10(b) of the Convention reads:

Provided the State of destination does not object, the present Convention shall not interfere with the freedom of judicial officers, officials or other competent persons of the State of origin to effect service of judicial documents directly through the judicial officers, officials or other competent persons of the State of destination.

Article 10(c) of the Convention reads:

Provided the State of destination does not object, the present Convention shall not interfere with the freedom of any person interested in a judicial proceeding to effect service of judicial documents directly through the judicial officers, officials or other competent persons of the State of destination.

An update to the UK declarations in relation to Scotland has been considered by the UK Ministry of Justice and has been sent to the Permanent Bureau of the Hague Conference on Private International Law. The practical information page on the Hague website has been updated to reflect the method of service for Scotland is through Messengers-At-Arms and their contact details can be found here

The Scottish Government considers that messengers-at-arms and sheriff officers can carry out service under the Hague Convention with immediate effect. Service requests from judicial officers, officials or other competent persons of the State of origin would fall under

Article 10(b); while service requests from any person of the State of origin who is interested in a judicial proceeding would fall under Article 10(c).

Fees for service under the Hague Convention

-The Act of Sederunt below has been made and came into force on Implementation Period completion day (i.e. at 11pm on 31 December 2020). This amends the Tables of Fees for messengers-at-arms and sheriff officers to include fees for service under the Hague Service Convention.

The actual costs of service will be advised to the requester by messengers-at-arms once they are in receipt of the request. The costs thereof must be paid in advance, in accordance with Article 12 of the Convention.
